All-Terrain Vehicle-Related Unintentional Injuries Arizona, 2003-2007

Unintentional injuries from ATVs are a public health problem impacting the lives of thousands of Arizona residents each year. Between 2003 and 2008, the age-adjusted death rate for ATV-related injuries among Arizonans increased from 0.27 deaths per 100,000 residents to 0.51 deaths per 100,000 residents. **This represents an 89 percent increase in the rate of deaths over six years.**

In addition to 172 ATV-related fatalities between 2003 and 2008, there were 2,224 inpatient hospitalizations and 12,422 emergency department visits due to non-fatal unintentional ATV-related injuries among Arizona residents between 2004 and 2007. Hospitalizations and emergency department visits do not include data from federal or tribal hospitals (Indian Health Services and the Veterans Administration).
